

## The Carraig Centre - UPDATE

## **Vision for the Carraig Centre**

We are aiming and praying for The Carraig Centre to be an updated Parish Centre at the heart of the community of Ballincollig and beyond. We prayerfully seek to be faithful to the great commission to 'Go into the world and make Disciples' (Matthew 28.18-20), AND seek to build God's kingdom through the local church. This will happen if we proclaim, both in words and actions, the gospel pointing to Jesus who is our rock for life. This gospel is a message of freedom in King Jesus, our Saviour and Lord.

The book of Jonah closes with a question God poses Jonah about Nineveh, saying; 'Nineveh has more than 120,000 people who cannot tell their right hand from their left, should I not be concerned about that great city?' (Jonah 4.11). God's heart for those far from him compels Jonah to reluctant action, and the future of that city is changed. God is the same yesterday, today and for ever and our hope is that The Carraig Centre will be a tool God can use to draw people into his Presence and Love.

#### **Refurbishment Due to Start This Autumn**

By the time CONNECT goes to print we should be very close to having a building contractor selected! This is another major milestone in this longer than expected process and one the committee has been eagerly anticipating. The only remaining hurdle to jump before we place the contract and start the refurbishment is the awarding of Fire and Disabled Access Certificates, a process which has been delayed by the boundary change in Ballincollig (jurisdiction moving from County to City Councils). The heritage nature of The Carraig Centre building has thrown up some challenges in meeting requirements and due to the boundary change timetable pressure, we couldn't complete the certification with the County Council. We expect this process to be complete and building to start before Christmas, exactly when is known only to God as the City Fire Office is very busy now with all the building projects underway.

After due process to get the estimated cost within budget, tender documents were issued at the end of June to six medium size contractors that have experience in managing projects of this scope within a heritage building situation. Bids are due back August 9 and the quantity surveyor and architects will issue a bid analysis and recommendation report by the end of August, upon which a contractor decision can be based. We are also starting work on

the procurement process for the LEADER/SECAD grant aided elements (lift to mezzanine, playground and ball playing areas and Audio-Visual installations in the Main Hall and Recording Studio). This process is rather bureaucratic, and we are grateful to our architects who are managing the majority of the effort. As a further encouragement, we have recently been awarded a small grant towards the kitchen equipment as well.

## **Tenant Negotiations Showing Progress**

Discussions have been on-going with prospective tenants. We have two significant tenant options and have engaged a letting agent (Global Properties) to negotiate on our behalf. We hope to conclude a deal over the next month or so and sign a contract during the autumn. We will be retaining our design team to manage the tenant side fit out to ensure continuity of design, though financing this part of the build is still open to discussion depending on leasing agreements.

#### **Governance Model with the Diocese**

Currently we are waiting for the Diocese to give their comments and (hopefully) approval for our governance proposal. The Diocesan Council referred our proposal for the establishment of a Carraig Centre Charitable Company Limited by Guarantee (wholly owned by CUP Select Vestry but which would hold a lease from the RCB for the premises) to the Chancellor of the Church of Ireland to establish its constitutional validity. This is not expected to be a problem, please God, but simply clears the ground for the future.

#### **Schedule**

With the uncertainty around the Fire Certificate it is hard to give a definite schedule for completion of the building programme! However, we would value your prayers for all the matters mentioned below and with hope in our hearts and trust in God's faithfulness throughout, we aim for completion by late spring 2020!

## **Prayers**

We are very grateful for your prayers! Main prayer points at this time are:

- Continued focus on God's lead and purposes amongst the committee.
- Thanks for good relationships amongst the team and committee
- Cost competitive quotations from the builders
- Rapid movement on the Fire/Disabled access certificates (more overleaf!)

- Clarity around the grant procurement process and vendor selection to ensure we get a satisfactory outcome for the lift, playground/ball playing area and A-V systems.
- Satisfactory negotiations with prospective tenants which will allow us a reasonable operating budget
- Clarity and speedy response from the Diocese on the governance model

#### **GOD CALLING!**

September 15<sup>th</sup> this year will be a key day in the experience of many Christians worshipping on this Sunday. Why am I so confident? Because the whole Church of Ireland is being asked to address the issue of vocation. There could be many like myself, who many years ago, on discovering Jesus is

alive, began to think of how I might serve him as Lord and what he wanted me to do with my life? Meeting Jesus challenges us to the core about our priorities. Even though most don't follow the path of ordination, every kind of vocation is deeply challenging while also satisfying: challenging because vocation isn't just about us, but about our openness to God and His purposes.

At the heart of my call to ordination was a vision of the church. With my new found faith I was excited about the church. It was all so new and enthralling — for my parents, decent and loving as they were, church was simply a matter of "hatch, match and dispatch"! While through the church I found love and acceptance - people who believed in me. It was a place where I could contribute, along with others who shared the reality of Christ alive, and who read the Bible as if their lives depended on it. This was worth signing up for and hey, this wasn't just happening to me at that time. Tens of thousands, probably hundreds of thousands, around the world were waking up from their slumber as God's Spirit brought revival, healing and a passion to serve.

Vocation has many manifestations and here is a great quote: "God is honoured by every human endeavour that comports with his good purposes for humanity and creation. **VOCATION - DOING WHAT COMES NATURALLY -** It was announced at the Diocesan Synod by Bishop Paul that he has invited the Rev Robert Ferris to help progress the Diocesan Strategy *Charting the Future with Confidence*. This

is an honour for Robert who has made himself at home in the Diocese, and we assure him of our prayerful support. We look forward to sharing in the inspiration and ideas as we face our own challenges of looking to the future, finding the particular vocation for each congregation within the Union. The St Senan's 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebrations have seen many connections with others, because a small group of leaders has a passion for music and biodiversity. Evenings of music flowing from the building into the grounds where small eco-friendly features celebrate what God is doing in His creation - God's music among the trees. It was only a few years ago that some thought the church had closed its doors. They are very much wide open!

8 young people (+ Matt!) recently went to the inaugural 'MOVE' - a five day youth event held in Clongowes Wood College.




It is run by 'Christ in Youth' and headed up by Jasper Rutherford - known to many in the parish and last year's Harvest speaker.

### **GOOD GOULD NEWS!**

Over the Summer Matt has been 'Admitted' as an 'Evangelist-in-Training' into the Church Army - an Anglican Mission Order with a focus on Evangelism which seeks to reach those on the margins of society.



He hopes this training will equip him to effectively lead evangelistic focus with the outreach activities in our Parish.

Some in the Parish will remember George Newell's ministry in Blarney, and within the wider diocese: Keith Dyde, Charles Harris and Norris & Kathleen Boyland. Rita (O'Donoghue from Blarney) and Kevin Metcalfe are also part of Church Army, working in England. Getting right up to date, Emma Bolster-Rodrigues was recently Commissioned as a Church Army Evangelist and is busy working in Ballina, Co. Mayo.

Church Army has a Vision in the coming years for seeing a number of 'Centre's of Mission' across the UK and Ireland, which aim to facilitate ministry work. This Vision is focused on a DARE strategy, which has four objectives:

Doing evangelism
Advocating evangelism
Resourcing evangelism
Enabling evangelism

Their values are (GRACE UP). We are:

**Generous** - God is generous and we want to model that generosity to others. **Risk-taking** - We have a long heritage as a pioneering movement, prepared to take risks and give colleagues permission to succeed or fail as they seek to do new things.

**Accountable** - We are accountable to God and others, living reliably and responsibly to high professional standards.

**Collaborative** - We are committed to partnership with those who share our values; we believe it enhances our work.

**Expectant** - We are hopeful, expecting God to do new things amongst us.

**Unconditional** - God loves everyone and everyone is significant in his eyes; we will serve anyone regardless of their age, gender, race, sexuality, faith, ability, status or circumstances.

**Prayerful** - Listening to God, being obedient to God, we want to be like Jesus in our life and witness.
