CUP CORK LIVING LIGHTLY & SUSTAINABLY

This month we are continuing to think about how we can reduce the impact our use of plastics has on the environment and ourselves.

Much of our clothing today is made with the use of synthetic fibres; polyester, nylon, acrylic etc. When washed they release microfibers (or tiny pieces of plastic) which get into the water system and eventually enter our rivers and seas, where they are ingested by marine life, and then eventually transferred up through the food chain to ourselves.

The following are some practical ideas to reduce the release of these microfibers into our water systems.

When buying clothing choose garments made from natural fibres, e.g. cotton, bamboo, and wool.

Wash clothing less often, this helps clothing to last longer as well as reduce your electricity bill.

Friction in the wash cycle increases the release of microfibers. You can reduce friction by; lowering the spin frequency and changing to liquid detergents such as products produced by Ecover and Winnies.

The Offering – please don't skip this!

Let's face it, reading the Bible about all the offerings made by the Jews to the Lord isn't exactly riveting reading. I guess most of the time we skip over the 1000+ references! But persevere and you sense that this is a way the people of God were shaped and held their community life together before the Lord – Yahweh.

Week in week out, scores of CUP members offer their service to God because in his Son he has freely offered a *perfect person to perfect some very imperfect people*!* It is this which creates our fellowship and we all have a role - the giving of ourselves in a 1000 different ways.

That's maybe an exaggeration, but not if you begin to add it all up over a year, and add the 1000's of euro it costs to keep CUP serving from week to week. So inside this Connect there is a reminder about how things work financially and about the ways to give. Much of it will be familiar. But please don't skip over

it! We simply ask that you might review your giving in faith, in the light of your circumstances, and make an offering for the glory of God.

And yes - like those offerings of old - it helps to help shape and hold our community life together before the Lord Jesus Christ. (Hebrews 10 v 14 The Message).

More Ripples - It is thrilling to hear of the Alpha training day in September in Rathpeacon where over 90 people from all over the south of Ireland came to learn how to run Alpha courses. It was in the 1990's that the first Alpha Course took place here in Carrigrohane Union, and some of those who found faith in new and exciting ways then, now meet with over 20 others in the Blarney Growth Group. And we congratulate Theresa Cronin for organising the event in her leadership role for Alpha Ireland - ripples of faith through the decades.



The ripples can also be traced back to the time our former rector the Rt Rev Harold Miller, as he introduced the Alpha course in Cork. Some from the parish have been invited to represent CUP at a special service in Down Cathedral to celebrate his ministry as deacon, priest and bishop - a

time to give thanks with Harold and Liz, and pray for their retirement.

Stepping out in Faith? All of us need to confess with our lips that Jesus is Lord. i.e. to take ownership of what we believe. Our baptism is a sign of this and if you were baptised as a child want to take ownership of what was promised for you, then it is good to consider the rite of Confirmation - our personal commitment.
