The Lighthouse—Messy Church in Blarney



On Sunday 23rd October our theme was Light. To begin there were 6 activities: icing and decorating sun, moon and star shaped biscuits as we thought about how God created light; tealight holders where glass jars were

decorated with designs to remind us of how Jesus' light is

with us always; science – lighting a bulb where circuits were built to light a bulb to remind us how we are to shine our light out into the world; stars where glow-inthe-dark stars were displayed to look at and to think



about how we reflect God light; stainedglass window decorations were created while thinking about the beauty of the colours God created; and the Bible as Light where bible verse pictures were created using

letter cut from magazines or a stencil.



During the Celebration there was time to sing, listen to the story and



pray. During the prayer-time we thought of places in the world where God's light needs to shine and we lit candles. The families were then encouraged to bring the candle home and to continue to pray.



The afternoon finished with time to chat as we ate curry and cake and saw the photos that had been taken during the activities.

With thanks to the Community Foundation for Ireland, we have been able to appoint Vika to this important part time role in helping the Ukrainian community around Cork city to settle well here in Ireland, as the war in Ukraine continues.



Viktoria will be spending 15 hour per week liaising with the Ukraine community here to help facilitate activities that help towards their social needs. This could be helping with housing matching, offering English classes, linking with parents in toddler groups, and other activities along the way. Watch out for a new choir in the coming weeks!

"Hinds' Feet in High Places" by Hannah Hurnard.



Fear stops us from being all that we can be and doing all that we're called to do. It's easier to sit tight and hope for the best that to learn the secret of victorious living. When we accept that our loving Shepherd is in control and we are not, we can learn to accept the daily circumstances of our lives that are permitted by God by laying down our own will and accepting His as is presented in the form of the people and events of our everyday lives. Every acceptance and every surrender of ourselves to His will takes us further to the High Places of love, joy and victory. This is where our Chief Shepherd wants to bring each of us in every age and stage of life. This beautiful allegorical story inspired me to trust Him with the twists and turns of everyday life.

Hinds' Feet on High Places is based on Habakkuk 3:19 and traces the journey of the orphan girl Much-Afraid, who escapes the from the clutches of her relatives and ventures out with the Chief Shepherd of the Village up to the High Places, where she is healed by love. Born into distressing circumstances and forced to live with two physical disabilities that hinder her ability to walk and to speak clearly or smile, Much-Afraid wants nothing more than to be physically healed and to be given "hinds' feet" in order to venture into the mountains and follow the Shepherd during his journeys up to the High Places, far above the troubles and strife found in the Valley of Humiliation.

She encounters the Shepherd, who leads her to the foot of the nearby mountains to begin her journey. Provided with two traveling companions, Sorrow and Suffering, Much-Afraid starts off on the path that will lead her up to the High Places and, so she hopes, to the fulfilment of her heart's desire. Along the way she must overcome natural disasters, geographical and circumstantial hardships, and worst of all, the attacks of various relatives — Self-pity, Resentment, Bitterness and Pride, who attempt to knock her off the Shepherd's path and bring her back to the Valley with them for good.

Learning to embrace Sorrow and Suffering, who never leave her side, Much-Afraid comes to a deep maturity during her travels, continuously learning how to submit her own will to that of the Shepherd, and even comes to embrace Sorrow and Suffering as friends as they prove to be most reliable and comforting guides. The tests and trials she experiences along the way, the pain she endures and her interactions with Sorrow and Suffering are the reason she is able to persevere and ultimately gain mastery of the fears that have continued to trouble her. She discovers that the long and arduous path she was given to walk was all in preparation for her new life of healing and transformation and was necessary for her to gain a renewed sense of self. Given the gift of a new life, Much-Afraid is also given a new name by the Shepherd: Grace and Glory. Along with her companions, Joy and Peace - formerly Sorrow and Suffering, she determines to set out for the Valley of Humiliation to draw others to the High Places and into the love of the Shepherd within the Kingdom of Love.

This book helped me to understand that Jesus, our Chief Shepherd wants us to live in joy and peace despite the sorrow and suffering of life. We don't have to be afraid, just trust him and keeping pushing through the trouble and we will see his grace and glory to such an extent, we might even identify ourselves by it.


Monday Moments and Tuesday Toddlers in Blarney

Time has flown very quickly since arriving in September! It has been great getting to know so many new people (the repetition of names is still much appreciated!) and to get a sense of the life in the parish community. It's also been great to be here when there is such a sense of re-building (from the effects of the pandemic) and looking ahead to discern God's direction in mission and ministry.

At the Church of the Resurrection in Blarney this has been unfolding in two ways: with the re-starting of one well-loved and in-demand activity, and with plans to experiment with something new. There has been much excitement as we have re-engaged with the **Blarney Toddlers** team and look ahead to restarting that group on **Tuesday**, **8 November**, 10.00-Noon. Moving with the times (and to manage numbers), pre-registration via Eventbrite will be required: https://www.eventbrite.com/o/blarney-toddlers-54748615273, with registration for each session opening on the Thursday prior. We are looking forward to once again offering a warm welcome and friendship to young children and their carers week by week.

We're also going to be trying something new in the months of November and December. From **Monday, 7 November**, the Church of the Resurrection will be open for prayer and as a drop-in between 9.00 AM and 12:15 PM. We're

calling it Monday Moments and it will include a short morning prayer from 9-9:15 am, an open time from 9:15 - 11:45 am to drop-in for a quiet moment, for curious visitors, for prayer, or for a chat and a cuppa (we may even be able to manage a few biscuits!). At the conclusion of the drop-in time there will be a short mid-day prayer service, around the themes of peace and healing. If you are coming and going through Blarney on a Monday feel free to stop by! If you know someone in Blarney who could use a quiet moment or a bit of chat on a Monday, send them our way! Saint Mary's Collegiate Church celebrates 800 years

St. Mary's Collegiate Church, in the heart of Youghal, is one of the oldest parish churches still in use in Ireland. This year its parishioners, as well as the Diocese of Cork, Cloyne and Ross and the wider Church of Ireland are celebrating 802 years of continuous worship at the church, stretching right back to its foundation in 1220.

Celebrating 150 Years Saint Luke's Home, Cork

On Tuesday, 18th October, The Feast of St Luke, a Diocesan Service of Thanksgiving to mark the Sesquicentenary of the Foundation of Saint Luke's Home, Cork in 1872 was held at Saint Fin Barre's Cathedral, Cork. Saint Luke's is a voluntary organisation under the patronage of the Church of Ireland in Cork, Cloyne and Ross, and the Right Rev. Dr Paul Colton, Bishop of Cork, Cloyne and Ross serves as President. The Home provides residential, respite and day care services for older people, with an emphasis on Alzheimer care and other forms of Dementia.



300 years St. Annes Shandon


The Tercentenary Celebrations of the Parish Church of Saint Anne, Shandon culminated in a Service of Thanksgiving on Sunday, 2nd October 2022. The Bishop of Cork, Cloyne and Ross, the Right Rev. Dr Paul Colton presided over the service, which was led by the Priest-in -Charge, the Rev. Meghan Farr. Dr Paula Gooder, Canon Chancellor of Saint Paul's

Cathedral, London and renowned preacher and New Testament Scholar, preached at the service.

Advent

The last Sunday of November sees the beginning of Advent—the season in the Church's year when we make preparations for the coming of Christ. This year there are a couple of things which we will be doing.

Some of us will be gathering in St. Finbarre's Cathedral for the Advent procession on Monday 28 November at 3.30pm. This service is a lovely way to begin the season.



A while back as a parish we had the opportunity to read various books together as a parish. I am hoping to restart this. This Advent season I hope that some of us will be able to read **Paula Gooder's book The Meaning is In the Waiting**

Its theme is overtly an Advent one, yet subsequent books will range over other biblical and seasonal topics. Paula Gooder provides a profoundly biblical guide to the season of Advent and we explore its central theme of waiting (something we are not good at in our modern culture) in the company of the biblical characters who feature prominently in the lectionary readings for the

season: Abraham and Sarah who waited for a child, Isaiah and the prophets who waited for judgement and redemption, John the Baptist whose role was to wait in the wilderness until the prophecies he foretold were realised, Mary whose waiting began in pregnancy and continued as she stood at the foot of the cross. Arranged for daily reading, this offers an exquisite meditation on the spirituality of waiting - the active doing of nothing - as a way of enhancing our lives and bringing us closer to God.


