New to the Parish?



Ascensiontide this year

As a parish we are participating in the Archbishop of Canterbury's call throughout Ascensiontide 9-19th May.

Thy Kingdom Come is a worldw ide prayer movement that happens each year between Ascension Day and Pentecost Sunday.



Those first followers responded to this promise by constantly devoting themselves to prayer (Acts 1:14), day after day, until the Holy Spirit came upon them in power. These precious days between Ascension and Pentecost can, for us too, be infused w ith expectation and anticipation. We too can set these days apart to pray, individually and together, for a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit. We can cry out to God for more people to come to know the life transforming love of God.

This year, we are invited to choose five people who do not yet know the love of God for themselves, and pray for them each day. This year's Prayer Journal explores a variety of ways to pray from across different denominations and traditions.

As you journey throu g h these 11 days, faithfully interceding for your five people, our hope is that you w ill be refreshed by what you learn, and inspired to encounter God in new ways.

We have circulated "Prayer Journals" to help us to pray – Each day has a particular devotion – I do commend these to you – They are available in our churches and also at the Carraig Centre reception desk should you like to have one.

On Pentecost Sunday 19th May I do commend the prayer event where we will have prayer stations which will be available 4.30-5.30 PM and then followed by a barbecue. This event will be open to all who would like to pray with us. We are also saying to families come along – we will have activities for kids as well as adults to engage with and be together as we pray.

At 5.30 there is a barbecue – we are asking people to register (for catering purposes). And if you are coming along to bring a salad or dessert to share. A form can be filled in on www.cupcork.ie/pentecost

The theme of the prayer stations is The Lord's Prayer and at 5.30pm we will join together with Christians across the world – Praying – Thy Kingdom Come as the Lord's Prayer is prayed.

Vocation means what you are called by God to be and do. For some, this is a specific calling to ministry.

For others, it can mean serving God through faithful discipleship in everyday life.

God calls each of us to different tasks.

He gave some to be 'apostles, some to be prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and some teachers.' *Ephesians 4: 11*.

Vocation isn't just about being ordained – ordination is not for everyone.

Indeed, many of the Church's ministers are not ordained.

Youth and children's ministers, evangelists, readers and many chaplains are generally not ordained, and are collectively known as lay ministers who serve alongside the ordained.

While the Church is keen to foster vocations to the ordained ministry, there are many ways in which to serve the Church

If you are wondering what God wants you to do with your life and are keen to explore further the various stages in discerning your call, you will find it helpful to speak with your Rector or local Diocesan Director of Ordinands. They can encourage you, as you prayerfully discern what area of ministry God is calling you to.


CUP Youth Update


New beginnings this term with our teen discussion group "Sunday PM on a Saturday" (We

We had two sessions on Good Friday, 29th March, in the Carraig Centre 10 – 11.30am and again in Blarney 2.30 – 4pm.


The same activities ran during each session: Dotty the Donkey trail, hand-print

Blarney toddlers takes place Tuesday mornings 10 - 11.45am during the school term. This year we have had a steady number of families in attendance each week and over recent months have had several new families enquire about attending, come along to try it out and then attend regularly.

Robert will be attending the Church of Ireland General Synod in Armagh

On the first day of its meeting (**Friday, 10th May**), the Service of Holy Communion will take place at 10.00am in St Patrick's Cathedral, on the Hill of Armagh where St Patrick built his 'Great Stone Church'. The preacher will be the Bishop of Clogher, the Rt Revd Ian W Ellis.

The Archbishop of Armagh and Primate of All Ireland, the Most Revd John McDowell, will make his Presidential Address shortly after the start of business on the first day. General Synod will continue in person on **Saturday**, **11th May**, with the third day's proceedings held remotely on the evening of **Tuesday**, **14th May**, and (if required) on the evening of Thursday 16th May.

Two presentations – from the Mind Matters COI project and the Primate's Reference Group on Ethnic Diversity, Inclusion and Racial Justice – are scheduled to be made just before lunch—time on Saturday.

Carraig Centre Spring Update

Lots going on in the Carraig Centre as always! We have had inquiries from several new groups for Summer Camps and autumn activities, including a Fashion and Sewing camp and classes and a Chess and Activities summer camp (of course along with our regular Lego, Art and YMCA camps). The autumn looks busy again with most of our regulars returning, but still with opportunities to fill a few gaps! Deirdre continues to do stalwart work managing the plentiful Birthday bookings on Sunday afternoons; we are currently booked out to the end of July!

We are working with Chris Southgate (of Blarney refurbishment fame) to see if he could work on the West Wing Development with us as well. We will have a decision on which way to go shortly, the primary driver being the requirement to stay with the budget allocated.

Parking continues to be a challenge at certain pinch points and we try to be aware of those times, but as our local community Garda said to me the other day, "You are victims of your own success". It was a Garda neighbourhood meeting which added parking complications the last time! Sarah Louise met peacefully with the neighbours and said it was very helpful meeting a few new neighbours of varying ages! I have notified various large user groups that they need to supply parking directors for their meetings.

Work on the installation of the Solar PV panels continues (the panels are installed but not yet hooked up at time of writing) and we are hoping that by the time you read this they will be fully installed and working to offset our electricity costs!

We have received a large anonymous donation for the work of the Carraig Centre and we are very grateful for this! Thank you whoever you are!

The Lighthouse Messy Church

2023-2024

The Lighthouse Messy Church which generally takes place one Sunday afternoon each month, except during the summer from 3.30 – 5.30pm. Unfortunately, we had to cancel the Christmas Lighthouse due to illness and lack of team.

In the past The Lighthouse was in Blarney Church but in September 2023 we made the decision to change to the Carraig

Centre. We did this as an experiment to see if we would have more families attend and also to build on the connections with the youth programme and to see if more young people would be available to help on the team. In general, the numbers attending have not changed: each month we have around 22 people attend, although on two occasions it was as low as 9; June 2023 in Blarney and February 24 in the Carraig Centre. The highest attendance was last September for the first one in the Carraig Centre where we had 35 in attendance. Since moving to the Carraig centre we have had more young people help on the team, although this has not been consistent from month to month.

Something else which we have trialled this year is to ask the young people at GlowMax to help with choosing the activities. Last October at GlowMax the young people came up with a very good list of activities for the Salt and Light themed Lighthouse to be help in November. This is something we would like to build on. Thank you to all the young people who helped plan that session. Thank you also to all those who have come and helped on the Lighthouse team.

Over this year we have covered the following themes: The Road to Emmaus, Pentecost, Compassion, God's Big Story, Harvest Thanksgiving, Salt and Lighthouse, Jonah and the big fish and Jesus' baptism and temptation. There has been a wide variety of games, crafts and other activities covered alongside the Bible stories, creative prayer times and songs.

The Lighthouse team have also been involved in other family events: The Harvest Family Fun morning in October, The Christmas craft in December afternoon and the St Patrick's craft afternoon on 16th March, all in Blarney and the Footsteps of Faith Family Fun events in July and August, and the Wondering through Holy Week on Good Friday in both the Carraig Centre and Blarney.

Thank you so much to all those who have helped run the Lighthouse in both Blarney and the Carraig Centre over this past year.

Meeting of the Easter General Vestry of Carrigrohane Union of Parishes held on Wednesday 17th April 2024 in the Church of the Resurrection, Blarney at 7.30pm.



Welcome & introduction

Robert welcomed everyone to the meeting. The last time there was a full Parish meeting in this building was just before the

decision was taken about the Carraig Centre. The vision that was poured out here is seeing fruit every day. TCC has €110,000 rental income which came from the sale of the South Field which yielded €250 a year.

Reading & opening prayer

Abigail opened in prayer. Robert read from Matthew — "you are the salt of the earth, the light of the world". The vision for Blarney church has always been the light on the hill. We are gathered in faith as we look forward to the future.

Minutes of previous meeting

The minutes of the meeting of 26 April 2023 were circulated, approved and signed.

Rector's address

Robert's address was entitled *Charting a Future with Confidence - Amidst the Challenges"*. He chairs the CaFwC Implementation Group for the Diocese. The aim is to grow healthy churches throughout the Diocese.

He commented that the key focus of the Report that he will be highlighting is that healthy churches focus on:

- nurturing disciples,
- engaging with children and young adults,
- clear mission and purpose,
- leaders who innovate, envision and motivate,
- they are willing to change and adapt,
- actively engage with their local context,
- foster a welcoming culture with ongoing relationships,
- encourage lay people in active leadership.

Confidence within the church needs to be grappled with. Ultimately our confidence is in Christ as Lord of the church. We worship a God who wants us to reach out in confident faith.

Robert believes that part of his calling is to encourage and help us to be good stewards of our gifts, those who care for all - young and old, rich and poor, and those who proclaim the Gospel by word and example.

He thanked all who call this Union of Parishes "family". He outlined the extremely long list of groups who are active in our Parish. He thanked all colleagues on the admin team - Deirdre, Jaki and Mary. Staff team — Matt, Sarah, Abigail. Spouses and families of all of these. He thanked Bill for all the projects taken on throughout the year, with his confident faith and vision. Ivan & Jane, Chuck & Kathy for their ministry and faithfulness through the years. Wardens Jane, Paula, Mel, Richard, April and Laurel. Robert and Ciaran for their work looking

after all our properties. Janice – for the challenges of the last year for her faithfulness, hard work and wisdom.

The new TCC Board, Bill Lane, Matthew Watson, Mel Harris, Julie Oates, Michael Crowley, Robert Devoy(Chair), Ivan McMahon as Consultant & Jane Moffatt as Company Secretary.

Robert also thanked Jessica Kindler for her work as Chairperson of the Carriag Centre board over the past 12 months and her service on the board prior to that.

Comments

Robert was thanked for all he does. Richard Bolster thanked Abigail for all she does for the congregation in Blarney. Robert Devoy reminded the meeting that so much has changed for the better over the years and so many have been blessed both within and outside of the Parish.

Adoption of Accounts

The Honorary Treasurer, Janice Healey Bird reported that in the previous year we received grants, gifts and our expenditure was down. Fair Share was less and our miscellaneous expenditure was less. The CUP 2023 Draft Budget comments from Janice in attached.

In Janice's notes she commented

- The deficit in 2023 balances the large surplus in 2022
- Giving and grants are up; property rental and tax rebates are down
- €30K has been spent on capital property works €12K St Peters; €18K Inniscarra;
- €18K drawdown from RCB for 2023 youth expenses coming in 2024
- Large increase in workload for CUP/TCC; Parish admin up €13K
- Large miscellaneous expenses include Ukrainian project (€28K) and Firedoors for TCC (€29K). We are expecting €4.5K grant towards this in 2024.
- Christmas Tree festival not generating meaningful funds; no other fundraising in 2023

Looking ahead:

- Need to support €18K increase in Fair Share costs
- Need to develop fundraising strategy other than general giving

Fair Share has gone up by €18K this year which reduces available funds considerably. We rely on donations from the congregation. We will have to fundraise this year. As we grow, the Fair Share grows as well.

The Carraig Centre has been set up as a separate charity and is owned by the Select Vestry. As a company it can avail of grants that are not available to churches. As it is fully owned by the Select Vestry, they elect the Board, the majority of members of which, must be vestry persons. Any maintenance or running costs don't fall to the Parish. The building is owned by the Parish but leased to the Company. TCC income cannot fund the Parish directly. A memo of understanding protects the Parish and Safeguarding Policies are same in both.

Michael Kenning proposed the adoption of the accounts and this was seconded by Robert Devoy.
